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Director's Corner

Summer has certainly kept us busy and we have dived right into fun. All classrooms have been exploring the city of Springfield. Many fun trips are still planned for July and even a few water fun days. To ensure your child does not miss a trip or walk please be sure to notify the teachers and office if your child is going to be late. Many classrooms try to beat the heat and leave at 9:30 or a little after.

I would like to thank the staff of Children's House, CBC and Compass for assisting all the children to safety during last month's storm. In less than one minute everyone was moved quickly and safely to the basement. We practice tornado safety with a drill twice a year with all classrooms. Staff review the information yearly during risk management training. Last month's storm reminded us why it is always good to be prepared and practice with drills.

I thought this might be a good time to review our tornado policy:

- * The director or designated staff will be weather informed by a radio or app when there is threatening weather. Director or staff will track the weather.
- *When a warning is issued or the director feels it is unsafe all children and staff will be relocated to the lower level of the building, the basement.
- *All organizations located in the building and support staff will report to first floor classrooms to assist younger children.
- * Elevators will not be used during the transition.
- * All classrooms will follow the tornado escape route posted in their classrooms.
- * Teachers will take emergency bags and clipboards (with child information sheets and attendance) with
- * Teachers will count all children before leaving the room and once they have reached the basement.
- *Director will ensure everyone has made it safely to the basement and then take count from each classroom.

July 2023

Director continued:

- *Once director has confirmed everyone is safe, they will contact families by email or Facebook posting.
- * No one may exit the building during the warning and seeking shelter.
- * Please note, there may not be an individual to answer the door or phones during this time. We will do our very best to have someone man the first floor unless deemed unsafe.
- * Director will track the weather and when it is safe to return to the classroom. Once this has been determined classrooms will be assisted back to their rooms.
- * Director will check with all staff and students and their well being. Parents will be notified when it is clear, and everyone is safely back.
